

POLICE REGULATIONS OF SLALOM AREA SPRING 2025

Article 1 – Scope of application

These rules of use define the access and usage conditions for the slalom area.

These rules apply to all users of slalom area throughout the 2 Alpes ski area.

All corridor reservations imply acceptance of these rules.

Article 2 – Reservation conditions

Reservations must be made on the website: <https://www.2alpestraining.com/>

Your login and password will be required to access the online platform. Users will receive a new password by e-mail at the beginning of each season.

In the event that you do not have a customer profile, you will need to request one through the online form "sign up".

Corridor reservations will only be validated the day before your arrival:

- You or another person representing you must go to the glacier the day before the reservation to attend the daily meeting during opening hours.
- Or contact + 33 (0)4 76 79 13 76 from 9:30am to 10 am.

Corridor reservations or requests that have not been confirmed prior to the reservation day as specified above will not be taken into account for the next day.

If a corridor is reserved and remains unused without informing the slalom area managers, the reservation for the following day will be cancelled.

Management may decide to close the slalom areas at any time for safety reasons and reserve the right to cancel reservations if these rules are not respected.

During busy periods, SATA 2 ALPES will do its utmost to fully satisfy your pre-reservation requests, but cannot guarantee **you an individual corridor**. You will be asked to gather together so that each club can train.

Article 3 – Corridor assignment and organisation

The slalom area managers are the contacts for coaches on the glacier.

They will decide the assignments according to athlete levels (national team, regional committees, etc.), discipline and age. They also ensure that the course is laid out as requested by coaches.

A daily schedule of assignments is updated and drawn up according to meeting attendance and confirmations received by telephone and will be displayed every day from 5pm, at the entrance to the JANDRI building and available on the online platform.

Daily meetings are mandatory to validate your reservation for the following day.

Meeting times are as follows:

- National teams and regional committees: 10:30 am.
- Other clubs: 11:00 am to 12:30 pm.

Every day when you get to the glacier, you must go to the "Espace Slalom" office to check your corridor assignment on the schedule, and sign to confirm your presence. You may then go to your corridor following the slope tracing rules defined in **article 6**.

Any corridor changes will be handled on a case-by-case basis according to availability and must be arranged through the slalom area managers.

If accessing the glacier is not possible due to weather conditions, meetings will be held in the resort (at the "Point de vente Jandri" office) at 10:30 am. If lifts up to the glacier stop before the set meeting times, attendance confirmations and reservations will be handled in the resort (at the "Point de vente Jandri" office) or by e-mail.

Coaches are required to remain informed of weather forecasts and conditions so as to anticipate the descent of their equipment in the event of bad weather the day before their departure. The SATA teams accept no responsibility for returning any equipment to the resort in the event of bad weather or closure of the Glacier.

Bulky equipment such as bags and unused ski or snowboard equipment may be stored in a dedicated area on the right, at the top of the Jandri lift arrival. Please note that this is an outdoor and unsupervised area.

Article 4 – Slalom area access and use

Users must:

- Comply with the Police Regulations of the Slalom area.
- Use the course laid out by their coaches, who will have previously evaluated the risks inherent in the area (infrastructure, imminent dangers, etc.).
- Adapt their speed and behaviour to their personal abilities in order to ensure their own safety and that of other users.
- Strictly comply with slope markings, signs and information provided along the different corridors.

Users are forbidden from:

- Using corridors when access is closed.
- Warming up at high speeds and ignoring the ten rules of safe skiing indicated on the slope map.
- Obstructing other skiers on the slopes.
- Leaving rubbish on the glacier.

Article 5 – Slope tracing

Coaches must wait at the top of each slalom area before laying out their assigned slalom lane. The layout starts with slalom lane number one, then proceeds in increasing numerical order.

If a coach is absent from a slalom lane, one of the slalom area managers will redesign the layout order. This manager is the only person authorised to do so.

Only one course per slalom lane.

Slalom lanes that are still free after 8:00 am may be used upon confirmation by a slalom area manager. To preserve their quality, slalom lanes must be smoothed over at the end of each training session.

Article 6 – Ski lift use conditions

Queuing behaviour is carefully monitored.

Any person or group showing a lack of respect (shoving, insulting, smoking, music, excessive noise, etc.) will be denied access. All groups of under-age children in the queues **must imperatively be supervised by an adult**. In the event of failure to comply with this rule, the entire group will be refused access to the gondolas.

Any damage to the Jandri gondolas caused by disrespectful or inappropriate behaviour will be charged in full to the persons responsible. SATA 2 Alpes teams are entitled to establish the facts and to draw up a report accordingly.

Access times (ascent) as well as the priority queuing system and running orders, sent before your training sessions and displayed at the Jandri, must be respected.

Armbands are assigned subject to the rules below and allow for using “reserved access” to the following ski lifts:

- Gold armbands:
 - o world's 30 best athletes in each discipline.
- White armbands FFS:
 - o World Cup and European Cup athletes from the French Ski Federation
- Two-tone armbands:
 - o Crosspark ski & snowboard athletes

The day before the reservation by 3:30pm, teams must come to the “Point de vente Jandri” office and collect their armband(s) which will give access to the priority queue at the Jandri (at 6:30am) and the drag lift Puy Salié.

Reserved access to the Jandri (descent) is authorised for:

- All non-skiing SATA 2 ALPES customers.
- All World Cup and European Cup groups of French Ski Federation accompanied by their coaches.
- “G4” card holders. These cards are solely distributed by glacier sector managers.
- Parasport athletes.
- Summer/winter Deux Alpes ski instructors with four customers (private lessons).
- Athletes and coaches with armbands.
- Oisans athletes

N.B.: Part of the Signal and 2 600m sectors will be accessible as long as snow conditions permit.

Article 7 – Violations

Slalom area and glacier sector managers are authorised to note violations of these rules and can decide to exclude a participant or of their group, which can take effect immediately.
