

RULES OF USE PRIVATE AREAS SPRING 2024

Article 1 - Scope

These rules of use define the access and usage conditions for the Puy Salié private slalom area.

These rules apply to all users of this zone throughout the 2 Alpes ski area.

All lane reservations imply acceptance of these rules.

Article 2 - Reservation conditions

Areas reserved for national teams and regional organisations.

All other requests will be studied on a case-by-case basis depending on turnout (available for private teams with ISF or district athletes).

To reserve a "Private Slalom Area", you must:

- Book a "Free Standard Corridor" on the following website: https://www.2alpestraining.com/
- Book a " Private Slalom Area" by e-mail at training2alpes@sataski.com or directly at the Slalom Area office at 3200m.

Reservations will only be approved after verification of the athletes' level.

The group manager in charge of the reservation must fully pay for the use of the private area in accordance with established rates.

Article 3 - Assignment and organisation

At the dedicated MON ESPACE Customer office:

- 1. A daily schedule will be drawn up and displayed at the ski resort's slope centre as of **5:00 pm**. It will be posted on the training space reservation platform.
- 2. It will be provided to participants on the day prior to the reservation **between 3:00 and 4:00 pm**, along with a package containing:
 - Armbands for reserved access to the Jandri Express at **6:30 am.**
 - Red bibs for speed.
- 3. Every day, at the end of your training, you will be asked to return all armbands and bibs to the Mon Espace Customer office before **3:00 pm**.
- 4. Since the return of equipment to the resort village cannot be guaranteed in the event of bad weather, coaches must keep abreast of weather conditions to ensure they are able to anticipate the return of their equipment (skis, poles, etc.) on the eve of their departure.

Article 4 - Slalom area access and use

Users must:

- Use the course laid out by their coaches, who will have previously assessed the risks of their immediate surroundings (infrastructure, imminent dangers, etc.).
- Adapt their speed and behaviour to their personal abilities in order to ensure their own safety and that of other users.
- Strictly comply with markings, signs and information provided along the various slalom lanes.

Users are forbidden from:

- Using slalom lanes with closed access.
- Warming up at high speeds and ignoring the ten rules of skiing indicated on the slope map.
- Damaging the facilities in any manner whatsoever.
- Leaving rubbish on the glacier.

Article 5 – Layout

Coaches must wait at the top of the slalom area before laying out their assigned slalom lane. The layout starts with slalom lane number one, then proceeds in increasing numeric order.

Giant & slalom:

Only one layout per slalom lane for the giant and slalom (max distance between gates of 28 m).

Speed:

Usage of the speed training area is subject to specific conditions: two mandatory lines for a speed layout (distance between gates of 30 m to 50 m).

To preserve their quality, slalom lanes must be smoothed over at the end of each training session.

Article 6 - Ski lift use conditions

Access is authorised in accordance with the facilities' regulations.

Armbands allow for using reserved access to the following ski lifts:

- Jandri Express (ascent and descent).
- Puy Salié 2 drag lift.
- Dôme Nord drag lift.

Part of the Signal sector will be accessible as long as conditions permit. Access point 2600 will be closed during the entire Spring 2024 season.

Article 7 - Rates and conditions of sale

1. Lane reservation

Puy Salié private area: €420 per day and per slalom lane.

16 racers allowed per line. Possibility of adding a maximum of two extra athletes for €40/day/athlete.

Speed slope: €840 per day and per course

36 racers allowed per line.

2. Refunds

In the event of cancellation:

- Two weeks prior: Full refund of the reservation cost.
- One week prior: 50% refund of the reservation cost.
- 6 days prior: No refund. Total fees: 100%.

In the event of bad weather:

- Closed: Full refund of the reservation cost.
- Unusable: equipment out of order, storm: Full refund of the reservation cost.

Refunds and compensation are subject to the sole confirmation of training area managers after an evaluation of the glacier's skiability and weather conditions.

3. Equipment loss

Any lost armband or bib shall incur a €30 charge.

Article 8 - Violations of the present rules

Slalom area and glacier sector managers are authorised to register violations of these rules and to decide the exclusion of a participant or of their group, with immediate effect.
